

# Bullying Bible Study

## Questions To Ponder

- What is your role when you see someone being bullied?  
Can you choose to not be involved, depending on the reason someone is being bullied?
- What is the most hurtful thing anyone has ever said to you?  
What is the nicest thing anyone ever said to you? How did it make you feel?
- Do you easily praise God and curse others with the same tongue?
- Do you find it difficult to stand up for others when your friends refuse to stand with you?
- Do you claim to never bully people at school but frequently ridicule those in your own family?
- How do you think those who call themselves Christians are perceived at your school?  
Do they have a reputation of *caring* for others or *criticizing* others? What differences can students point to between those who claim to love and follow Christ and those who only live for themselves?
- What did your acceptance by God cost Him? (The life of His son, Jesus).  
What will your acceptance of others cost you? (Maybe your pride, your 'status', your comfort?)
- We want to say, "Hate the sin; love the sinner." But do we *really*? We don't seem to have much trouble with the first, but do we really follow through with the second?  
Where's the proof?
- Do we say, as Christians, "Once you become like us, *then* you can join us?" Jesus didn't. He accepted people *just as they were*.
