

THE FORGOTTEN COMMAND DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

SESSION 2 – THE GREAT COMMISSION

Discussion Questions:

1. What were the four primary passages of Scripture that present Jesus' "Prime Directive" (His Great Commission) to His followers?
2. The first obstacle that often keeps Christians from fulfilling The Great Commission is "doubt." Have you ever doubted God's existence? Perhaps you have not doubted His existence, but have you ever doubted God's presence with you at a given moment in time since becoming a Christ-follower? How did God help you overcome your doubts?
3. The second obstacle that often keeps Christians from fulfilling The Great Commission is the fear of confrontation. Have you ever been timid about sharing Christ with someone because you did not want to appear confrontational? If so, what did you fear might happen if you confronted that individual with the message of Jesus Christ?
4. A person's lack of understanding the disciple-making process is often an obstacle to fulfilling Christ's Great Commission. What is the process of making disciples of Jesus? How is your church involved in that disciple-making process?
5. The video stated, "Too often Christians forget that making disciples is a divinely spiritual assignment that requires Christ's involvement" (the fourth obstacle to fulfilling The Great Commission – "Trying to 'go it alone'"). What can churches do to help their members prepare spiritually for the task of making disciples?

Personal Application:

In the video, it was stated that the way to overcome the obstacles to fulfilling Christ's Great Commission is "revelation" (studying and sharing the revealed Word of God and revealing God's principles to others by living out those principles in our lives for them to see). Are you consistently studying and applying God's principles in your life? Can others see Jesus in you (in your attitudes, your actions and your words)?

What are you doing personally that might send "mixed signals" to others? In other words, are there any sins in your life that might be confusing to others? If so, confess and repent of those sins and ask The Lord to help you live a consistently Christ-like life.
